LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

To Our Lighthouse Community,

Years ago, I spent a weekend helping my friend Greg, who'd bought a house on the outskirts of Boston, build a backyard deck. We were in our 20s, and such an endeavor felt ambitious and exciting. I even bought a power drill for the occasion. Just owning such a thing seemed like a bold step into adulthood.



Greg's father, a kind, funny, professor of psychology and New Jersey native, drove up to help. I vividly remember digging post-holes in the hard soil, blisters quickly forming on my hands, but loving the process—it was perhaps the first thing I'd ever helped build, aside from a sad soda-can lamp in 8th-grade shop class.

As we dug one particular posthole, we got about two feet down before we encountered a large rock, which, as we continued to clear more earth, proved to be a massive boulder, an impervious object. Greg was worried that the town inspector might not approve the project, as all post holes needed to be at least three feet deep. Greg, an engineer and a stickler for details, grew upset and considered scrapping the entire project, but his father would have none of it. "Greg, babe," he said, "it's fine. It's like wu wei, you know? Wu wei, going with the universe's plan."

The last sentence isn't exactly a direct quote, but the salutation most certainly is.

Greg's dad suggested that the boulder would provide the perfect foundation for a post and that we should embrace it. In an impromptu lecture, the three of us standing shirtless in the afternoon sun, he advised that we accept what the earth provided and move on. He went on to say that wu wei was a little like going with the flow—taking the direction and energy of the cosmos and, with an open mind and heart, follow it with a curious and gentle nature.

Needless to say, Greg and I still refer to his dad as Wu Wei. An ancient Daoist concept has become a nickname.

2021 was a year with strong currents and many immovable actualities. A pandemic, societal upheaval, anxiety-ridden uncertainty, you name it. A year in which pressing against the forces of the cosmos would be a fool's errand. The way to survive was simple: take a calm, long view, see where the energy of the universe seems to be leading, and relax into it.

I can't say Lighthouse as a community or organization consciously followed the precept of wu wei, but looking back, it sure feels that way. And by doing so, I believe we saved ourselves a good deal of friction (and failure). The Lighthouse community itself—our writers, members, and faculty—embraced the vivid unknown, "taking no action that is not in accord with the universe." *

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

We settled onto Zoom. We held onto writing as a form of sanity-keeping and emotion-processing. We followed the invisible patterns of the ether toward a mindset of generosity and good cheer. Toward heartfelt caring. Toward a tentative vision of a future that would eventually leave all the unknowns and, maybe someday, get back in person.

I am deeply proud of the ways in which the Lighthouse staff, board, and community supported and cared for one another, and how we embraced a once-in-a-lifetime confluence of challenges. Personally, I don't know how I would have survived 2021 without all the beautiful words people wrote and shared and how we were so kind and nurturing to one another.

Some specific highlights:

- Over the course of the year, Lighthouse gave out over \$120,000 in tuition assistance to writers and literary types of all ages.
- Our participants were truly worldwide, with writers from all over, including all across the US and far-flung places, including Haiti, Pakistan, Costa Rica, Bulgaria, the Netherlands, India, China, Scotland, British Columbia, and at least 48 states. In all, over 16,000 writers and readers attended workshops and events.
- Adult community engagement programs, like Hard Times-for folks experiencing housing insecurity or financial challenges, and Writing to Be Free—for women emerging from incarceration, continued virtually, serving over 4,500 individuals.
- During an all-virtual Lit Fest, Hanif Abdurraqib (future MacArthur Genius Grant winner), Carolyn Forché, Layli
 Long Soldier, Mat Johnson, Gregory Pardlo (Pulitzer Prize winner), Sarah Ruhl, T Kira Madden, Rebecca Makkai,
 Leslie Jamison, and many others rounded out our all-star roster of visiting authors.
- The Book Project was able to provide two fellowships, which went to authors Tochukwu Okafor and Jiyhun Yun, both of whom are working on first novels.
- The Book Project also had an embarrassment of riches in terms of teaching fellows, including Angelique Stevens and Ladane Nasseri, both of whom teach and write professionally, and are at work on first memoirs.
- Young writers community engagement worked with over 70 schools, serving over 1,600 kids. Here's what one young writer had to say: [or this could be an inset or highlight somewhere else]

Back to the impressive boulder in Greg's backyard: the inspector, a tall, grizzled, lanky New Englander, took one look at the thing and said, "Looks like you got a solid ground floor right there," and approved the permit.

Wu wei and solid foundations indeed. Onward to 2022, where Lighthouse will celebrate its 25th year, and, hopefully, a gradual return to in-person.




